## **IUCN Academy of Environmental Law**

### **Guideline 6**

#### **GUIDELINE REGARDING USE OF THE IUCN ACADEMY NAME**

##### **IUCN Academy Member Institutions**

Under the Bylaws of the IUCN Academy of Environmental Law, membership of the Academy is available to institutions in the form of University law faculties, schools, departments and specialist environmental law research centres. Only institutions which have joined the Academy and which are currently members in good standing are entitled to identify themselves as ‘members’ of the Academy. **An individual appointed to or employed by an institutional member of the Academy does not, by virtue of such employment or appointment, become a member of the IUCN Academy of Environmental Law and has no authorization to identify himself or herself as a member of the IUCN Academy of Environmental Law. [See below.]**

**Self-identification by an institutional member of the Academy is authorized for the purpose of advising the fact of their membership via a web-site or in annual reports, promotional materials or other similar documents prepared for the purpose of describing their affiliations and activities.**

Self-identification by an institutional member of the Academy is authorized when undertaking activities on behalf of or in collaboration with the Academy for purposes of carrying out the objectives of the Academy’s license agreement with IUCN. Such activities might include hosting or convening an Academy conference or workshop or conducting research and curriculum development that form part of the Academy’s program of activities.

**It is necessary in all instances for a member institution of the Academy that seeks to engage in activities on behalf of or in collaboration with the Academy to have obtained prior written consent from the Secretariat of the Academy in relation to such activities.**

## **Individual Scholars**

Individuals serving on Academy institutions and committees and the Academy Secretariat are entitled to refer to their membership thereof in connection with the work or activities of the relevant institution or committee or the Secretariat and may also refer to such membership within their personal curricula vitae where information concerning professional service or experience is ordinarily presented. It is expected that the list and composition of these institutions will continue to change from time to time under the direction of the Governing Board. For illustrative purposes the following are noted: Governing Board, Research Committee, Teaching and Capacity Building Committee, Finance Committee, Governance Committee, Membership Committee, IT and Communications Committee, The Academy Secretariat.

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
